INDIGENOUS WOMEN AND GIRLS
☐ Ensure culturally-safe engagement policies
$\hfill \square$ Include Indigenous women in candidates for Mayor, Council, School, and Park Board
AFFORDABLE HOUSING
$\hfill\square$ Build more safe, low income, affordable housing units that are women friendly
CHILD CARE
$\hfill \square$ Partner with the provincial government to create new spaces and facilities
ELECTORAL REFORM
□ NPA doesn't endorse any of the proposals
ENDING VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN
☐ Conduct a full safety audit of the City of Vancouver
☐ Allocate funding for organizations doing anti violence work
$\Box$ Organize a city-wide, anti-violence campaign, coordinated by the Mayor's Office and women's anti-violence organizations
ENVIRONMENT, CLIMATE CHANGE, AND RESILIENCE
$\square$ Review the City's Greenest City Action Plan and emergency preparedness strategies related to climate change with a gendered intersectional lens
$\hfill\Box$ Enhance community engagement strategies to ensure the inclusivity of diverse women and girls
TRANSPORTATION
☐ Create safer transit and stations

WOMEN, WORK, AND INCOME
☐ Advocate for a provincial and federal anti-poverty plan
YOUNG WOMEN
$\hfill\Box$ Fund programs that support the creation of women-friendly service hubs and incubators to develop skills and networks
$\Box$ Create gender-specific programs to learn about, and participate in city planning, municipal elections, and other civic engagement activities
IMMIGRANT, MIGRANT, AND REFUGEE WOMEN
☐ Hire a City advocate to support immigrant, migrant and refugee women
$\square$ Address systemic barriers present in areas such as housing and violence
INTERSECTIONALITY
$\Box$ Develop a gendered intersectional framework to be applied to all City policies, programs, budgets, funding, staffing and governance
